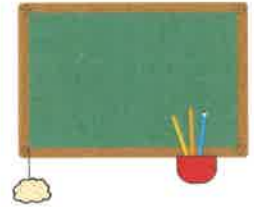

Accepted Documents for Proof of Residency

Unless you lack a fixed, regular, adequate residence, you must provide documentation showing you reside on a regular, fixed, nighttime basis at the address provided. *All documents must be current (within the last 30 days) and show your name and address.* To guard your security, please block out account and social security numbers on the documents before you present them.

Category A – provide at least one (1)

- Real estate tax bill
- Signed lease and proof of last month's payment (canceled check or receipt)
- Mortgage document or payment
- Military housing letter
- Section 8 letter

Category B – provide at least two (2)

- Gas bill
- Electric bill
- Water/sewer bill
- Phone bill (not mobile phone)
- Cable bill
- Vehicle registration
- Bank statement
- Public aid card
- Medicaid card
- Food stamp card
- Credit card statement
- Pay check stub
- City sticker receipt

*Please contact your child's school office if you are having trouble collecting all required documents.

Warning: A person who knowingly or willfully attempts to enroll a child in the school of a School District on a tuition-free basis when a nonresident of the School District, unless the nonresident child has a lawful right to attend, is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and will be liable for payment of tuition, fees, and all other applicable fines from the date the student began attending a District school as a nonresident.



PowerSchool Instructions

PowerSchool is a tool for parents to use to pay fees online and look at your child's progress in the classroom.

In August you will receive a code to set up your PowerSchool Account.

When you are given this code you can go to www.antioch34.com and if using a cell phone go under the families tab and then to PowerSchool.

There you can create your account with the access code you are given.

If using a computer, under the website you can either go to Families tab and follow above instructions or simply click on the PowerSchool button and create your account.

Please keep your user name and password handy to log in.

If you have other children in the district you can simply add your Kindergartener to your PowerSchool account once you receive the code in August.



D34 Birthdays at School Policy

Your child's birthday is an exciting event for you and for them. School can help promote a positive learning environment by providing healthy celebrations that shift the focus from the food to the child. In order to continue our approach to healthy eating, we approach birthday celebrations in a non-edible way.

*****This means food is not accepted in the classrooms to celebrate birthdays.**

Here are some ways to celebrate your child's birthday at school:

- ✓ In all grades, we welcome parents/guardians, other family members, or special friends to visit the classroom to read a book to the class. It can be a special one that the child has picked out or one that the reader has chosen. Please contact your child's teacher to arrange a time that is suitable for you both. Email is the best way to contact your child's teacher.
- ✓ Purchase a gift for the classroom, wrap it, and the teacher will have your child unwrap the gift and share it with the class. Examples are a puzzle, book, card game or game for the classroom. Contact the teacher for other suggestions for the room. Your child will be surprised and the gift will be used over and over during the year.
- ✓ Goodie bags will be allowed. However, they must be filled with non-edibles such as: pencils, erasers, stickers, rings, little puzzles, books, small notebooks, crayons, yoyos, bubbles, balls, etc. The students enjoy receiving them, using them in class or taking home these treats. *****No edible items can be distributed either individually or in the bags.**
- ✓ Have your child bring his/her favorite book to be read to the class. Your child or the teacher can read the book.

Please know that all teachers have their own special way of celebrating birthdays in their classroom. Please ask what you can do to assist them.

Healthy celebrations are an important part of providing a healthy school environment. They promote positive lifestyle choices to reduce student risks and improve learning.



D34 Healthier Snack Policy

Dear Parents/Guardians of Kindergarten Students,

Welcome to the 2021-2022 school year in District 34! We are very excited to help our students grow and learn this year. One important part of learning is making sure our bodies and minds are prepared and ready to learn. We know it is important to get lots of fresh air, exercise, sleep, and **healthy foods**. One healthy food choice that we can help our students make here at school is to eat a fruit or vegetable at snack time in the classroom. Snacks this year **must be** a fruit or vegetable. Below is a list of acceptable snacks.

Here are some examples:

Fruits

Apples, apple sauce, apricots, bananas, blackberries, blueberries, cherries, cranberries, dates, dried fruit, figs, grapefruit, grapes, kiwi, mango, melon, nectarines, oranges, papaya, peaches, pears, pineapple, plums, raisins, raspberries, strawberries, tangerines, watermelon, fruit cups drained of juice and placed in a sealed container

Vegetables

Peppers (green, red, yellow), broccoli, carrots, cauliflower, celery, cucumber, pickles, cherry tomatoes

***dipping sauces, fruit snacks/rollups or fruit juices will not be allowed.

Bus Transportation

The district provides bus transportation to and from school for all student living 1.5 miles or more from the school. A list of bus stops will be published at the beginning of the school year before student registration. Parents must, at the beginning of the school year, select one bus stop at which a student is to be picked up, and one stop at which a student is to be dropped off. Students are not permitted to ride a bus other than the bus to which they are assigned. Exceptions must be approved in advance by the building principal.

While students are on the bus, they are under the supervision of the bus driver. In most cases, bus discipline problems can be handled by the bus driver. In the case of a written disciplinary referral, student bus problems will be investigated and handled by the building principal.

Students are expected to follow all school rules while on the bus. Students may be suspended from riding the school bus for up to 10 consecutive school days for violating school rules or for engaging in other gross disobedience or misconduct. The school board may suspend the student from riding the school bus for a period in excess of 10 days for safety reasons. The district's regular suspension procedures shall be used to suspend a student's privilege to ride a school bus.

A student who is suspended from riding the school bus and who does not have alternative transportation to school shall be allowed the opportunity to make up all missed work for equivalent academic credit. It is the responsibility of the student's parent or guardian to notify the school that the student does not have alternative transportation to school.

In the interest of the student's safety and in compliance with State law, students are also expected to observe the following:

1. Dress properly for the weather. Make sure all drawstrings, ties, straps, etc. on all clothing, backpacks and other items, are shortened or removed to lessen the likelihood of them getting caught in bus doors, railings or aisles.
2. Arrive 5 minutes prior to your pick-up time, and stay away from the street while waiting for the bus.
3. Stay away from the bus until it stops completely and the driver signals you to board. Enter in single file without pushing. Always use the handrail.
4. Take a seat right away and remain seated facing forward. Keep your hands, arms, and head inside the bus.
5. Talk quietly on the bus. No shouting or creating loud noises that may distract the driver. Tablets, iPods, iPads, smart phones, and other electronic devices must be silenced on the bus unless a student uses headphones.
6. Help keep the bus neat and clean. Keep belongings out of the aisle and away from emergency exits. Eating and drinking are not allowed on the bus.
7. Always listen to the driver's instructions. Be courteous to the driver and other students. Sit with your hands to yourself and avoid making noises that would distract the driver or bother other passengers. Remain seated, keeping your hands, arms, and head inside the bus at all times.
8. Wait until the bus pulls to a complete stop before standing up. Use the handrail when exiting the bus.
9. Stay out of the danger zone next to the bus where the driver may have difficulty seeing you. Take five giant steps away from the bus and out of the danger zone, until you can see the driver and the driver sees you. Never crawl under a bus.
10. If you must cross the street after you get off the bus, wait for the driver's signal and then cross in front of the bus. Cross the street only after checking both ways for traffic.
11. Never run back to the bus, even if you dropped or forgot something.

Bus Conduct

Students are expected to follow all school rules when riding the school bus. A student may be suspended from riding the bus for up to 10 consecutive school days for engaging in gross disobedience or misconduct, including but not limited to, the following:

1. Violating any school rule or school district policy.
2. Willful injury or threat of injury to a bus driver or to another rider.
3. Willful and/or repeated defacement of the bus.
4. Repeated use of profanity.
5. Repeated willful disobedience of a directive from a bus driver or other supervisor.
6. Such other behavior as the building principal deems to threaten the safe operation of the bus and/or its occupants.

If a student is suspended from riding the bus for gross disobedience or misconduct on a bus, the School Board may suspend the student from riding the school bus for a period in excess of 10 days for safety reasons.

A student suspended from riding the bus who does not have alternate transportation to school shall have the opportunity to complete or make up work for equivalent academic credit. It shall be the responsibility of the student's parent or guardian to notify the school that the student does not have alternate transportation.



BUS TRANSPORTATION GUIDELINES

The following guidelines apply to student transportation and assigned bus stops.

1. Transportation is only provided within the school's attendance area.
2. Students are allowed only one route and bus stop to and from school.
3. Students are assigned a specific stop and route. They must use this stop on a daily basis.
4. Students must be at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to their scheduled pickup time.
5. Students must depart buses at their assigned stops on a consistent five (5) day a week basis.
6. Pick up / drop off stops may be different on one route, but each must be on a continuing five (5) days basis and must be within your student's school boundaries.
7. If your student is picked up / dropped off at a day care center / caregiver, that day care center/caregiver, must be located within the boundaries of the school in which the student attends.
8. Drivers will be instructed not to allow students to ride any bus other than their assigned bus, except for emergency purposes. If an emergency occurs, a note must be provided to the driver, which has been approved and stamped by the school office.
9. We will not be able to make bus changes to accommodate, birthday parties, scout meetings, play dates, school projects, doctor/dental appointments, etc.
10. If a parent is unable to pick up their kindergarten student from the bus stop you must contact transportation at 847-838-8388 and give the names of authorized people to accept your kindergarten student from the bus.

Home Language Survey
