




Composite is an average of Math and ELA scores for all grade levels and all students. Scores in percentages




This is the entire District English Language Arts (ELA) PARCC scores – all numbers are in percentages



This is the entire District Math PARCC scores – all numbers are in percentages




This slide represents the break out by grade level for the entire district ELA PARCC scores – all numbers are in percentages.




This slide represents the break out by grade level for the entire district Math PARCC scores – all numbers are in percentages.




In 2014-2015 we had 12.1% of our student population in the subgroup IEP this is comparable to the number of IEP students we have had in past years.




This slide represents the District 34 IEP students compared to the State IEP students fro English Language Arts




This slide represents the District 34 IEP students compared to the State IEP students for Math






This slide represents the District 34 Free and Reduced Lunch students compared to the State Free and Reduce Lunch status students for English Language Arts




This slide represents the District 34 Free and Reduced Lunch students compared to the State Free and Reduce Lunch status students for Math


This slide represents the District 34 LEP subgroup compared to the State LEP subgroup students for ELA




This slide represents the District 34 LEP subgroup compared to the State LEP subgroup students for Math
